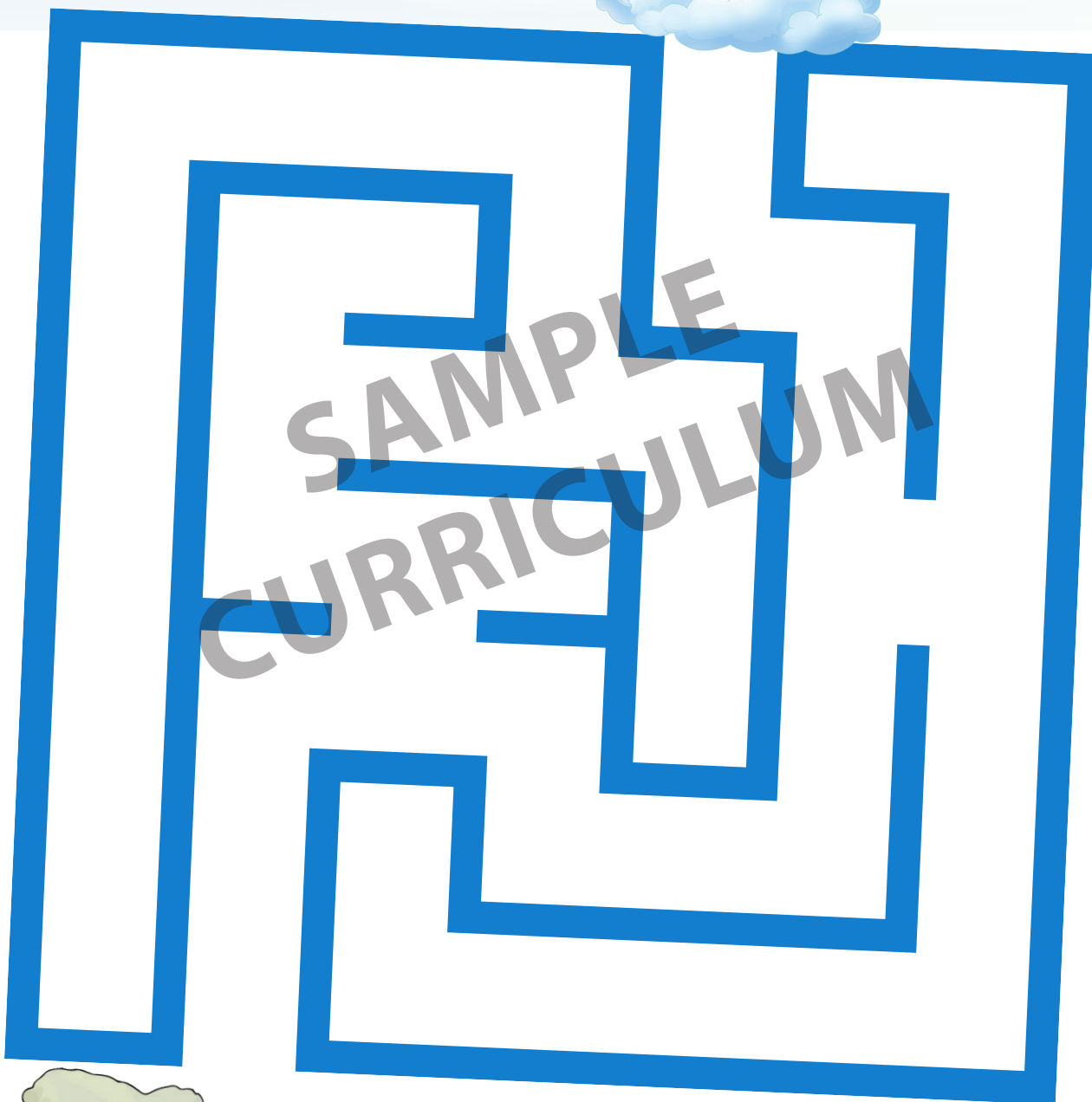

Synopsis:

Teacher Note:

Talk for a while about how beautiful Heaven is, and that everyone who has believed on Christ is going to go there someday! Ask the children if they have ever been to a big party; perhaps for a birthday or especially a wedding. Take a moment to discuss what preparations were made so that the children could enjoy the party. Talk about the decorations, the food, the party favors, the games, etc ...

According to our memory verse, Jesus is preparing a beautiful place called Heaven. Heaven is going to start out

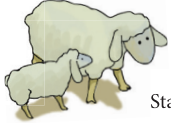
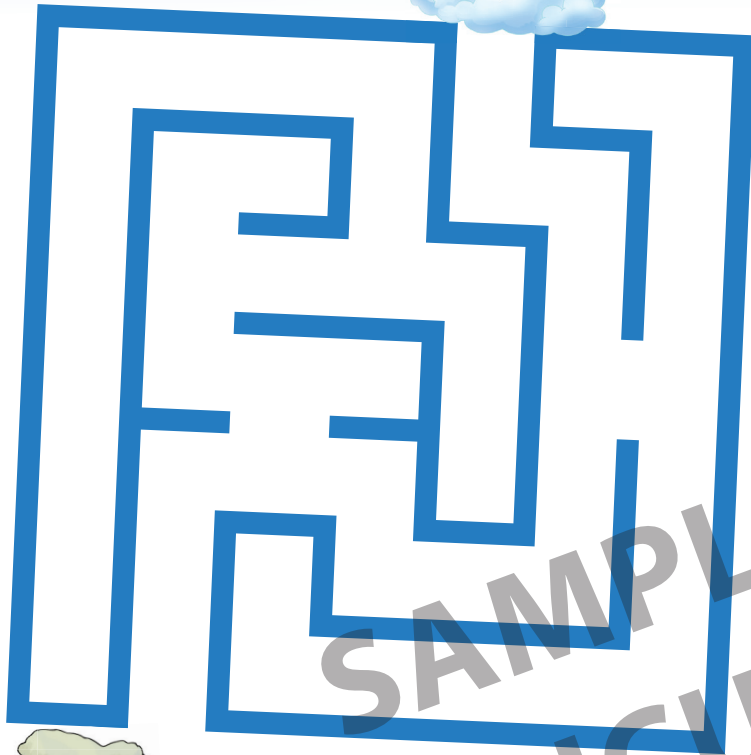

Teacher Note:

Review Proverbs 1:8 and require the Clubbers to say with only one or two helps.

FOCALpoint: Focus on the lineage of Jesus.



CHALLENGEpoint: The word lineage means a line of people called ancestors that is traced back to one person. Think of a lineage this way: a **line** through the **ages**. Discover a few of the names in Jesus' lineage.

Jesus' Lineage in Matthew's Gospel emphasizes the theme, Jesus As King.

Jesus had a human mother. Her name is Mary. Jesus, God's Son, came from Heaven and was placed inside Mary, and she gave birth to Jesus.

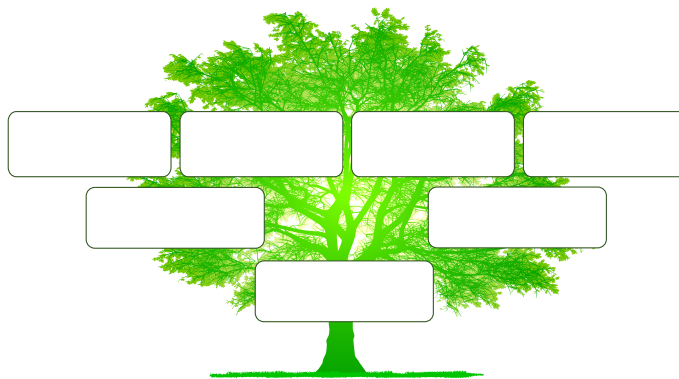
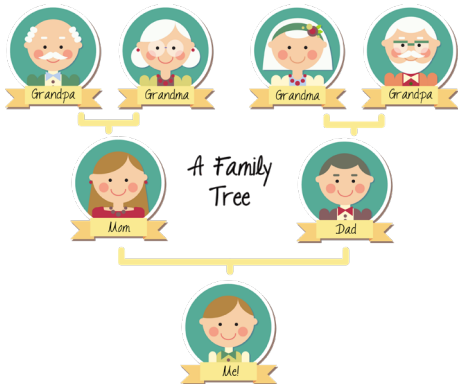

- Day 3.** Read Romans 5:6. The middle portion of your verse says, "*in due time.*" This means that God sent Jesus Christ to earth at precisely the exact time that He knew was best. Often in life, Christians feel like God is not answering their prayers, but God has His perfect timing.
- Day 4.** Read Romans 5:6. The last portion of your verse says, "*...Christ died for the ungodly.*" In your own words, write down what it means to be ungodly: _____

FOCALpoint: Today, you will focus on the lineage of Jesus Christ. You will need to explain the terms lineage and ancestors to help children understand that this is Jesus' family tree.

CHALLENGEpoint: Your Ambassadors will be researching family members of Jesus. Remind them that God has a special purpose for each person chosen to be a part of His lineage. When answering the question about the women in His lineage, stop and discuss the stories of those women. Why would God choose them? As your Ambassadors come across people, with which they are familiar, discuss their life and the choices they made.

ANSWERS

What is the name of the King that Jesus is related to in Matthew 1:1? **David**

“...And Jesse begat **David** the king...”

In Matthew 1:6, what is the name of King David's son? **Solomon**

In Luke 3:23, it says, “And Jesus...the son of **Joseph**...”

Notice the three words in parentheses in the same verse: “...(as was **supposed**)...”

Leader: Explain that Joseph was not Jesus father. Read Matthew 1:18. Mary was “*found with child of the Holy Ghost.*” Jesus' father is God the Father. If Joseph and Mary married and then had Jesus, then Jesus would have inherited Adam's sin-nature from his human father, Joseph. Joseph and Mary were married later.

Luke traces Jesus' lineage all the way back to the first man. In Luke 3:38, you discover that his name is **A d a m**. His name means “man.”

HOME

Children may need help from their parents to fill in the names on their family tree.

VIEWpoint: Dedicate a portion of the night discussing how, as Christians, we are the “sons of God.” You read in Luke 3:38, that Adam was “the son of God.” Adam never had a birthday, and he did not have a dad and mom because God created Adam. Read 1 John 3:1. When you ask Jesus Christ to be your personal Saviour, you are born again. This day becomes your spiritual birthday. Read John 3:7. Jesus told Nicodemus that he had to be born again. You have a new birth. It is like having a second birthday. God now calls you “sons of God.” That means that you are born into God's family. You learned from reading Luke 3 that Adam and Jesus are related.

CHECKpoint: Have each child explain the definition of lineage and explain some of the people in Jesus' lineage. Once they have completed this, sign and date their CHECKpoint.

Scripture Memory: In order to be consistent among crowns, each Ambassador will say thirty verses a year to correspond with the thirty week format. However, because the Member Guide takes the first three weeks of the Bronze crown, there are three times where they will need to say three verses total in one setting. Because there are three verses to say, they are shorter, more familiar verses. Explain to your Ambassadors, that in order to complete all three Scripture Memory badges in one year, they need to say three at a time.
